RACE DAYS

With one of the wettest summers on record, the northern region racing and trial program was significantly impacted. This has been exacerbated by the fact that two major racetracks (Ellerslie and Te Aroha) are currently undergoing major renovations so are unavailable to race or trial.

The Auckland floods and Cyclone Gabrielle that hit the Northland, Auckland, Waikato, Bay of Plenty and Hawkes Bay regions in January and February caused significant destruction to life, land, roads, and property. We know that trainers and industry participants have suffered loss and damage, which for some will take considerable time, effort, and finance to repair. On behalf of the Club our thoughts are with you, and we wish you a speedy return to normality.

Fortunately, it appears that most of the racecourses in the region escaped relatively unscathed from the cyclone although a photo of the Hastings track shortly before their programmed Wairoa Cup Day shows the track looking more like a lake than a racecourse. The meeting was subsequently abandoned.

On a brighter note, the terrible weather provided an opportunity for the industry to utilise the Cambridge Polytrack which was designed to cope with inclement weather events. Two unprogrammed meetings were hosted by the Club, on 8 and 16 February. Both meetings were scheduled at short notice, because of the weather in the wider region. Ironically the two meetings were held on warm clear days, and were well attended, with the public enjoying the friendly picnic atmosphere.



CLUB HAPPENINGS



Ordinarily over the summer months staff would be watering tracks, stabling areas, and laneways to keep the dust down and ensure the tracks are well prepared. However, this summer has seen the use of water pumps to remove excess water from the ploughs and facilities in order to get them back to an operational standard.

The Club is fortunate that this type of disruption, when some tracks are closed, is mitigated by the flexibility that the all-weather Polytrack provides. Regardless of the weather our trainers always have tracks to work their horses.
